

AGREED WALK TOGETHER

Amos 3:1 Hear this word that the LORD hath spoken against you, O children of Israel, against the whole family which I brought up from the land of Egypt, saying, **2** You only have I known of all the families of the earth: therefore I will punish you for all your iniquities. **3** Can two **(1)walk (2)together**, except **(3)they be agreed?** (KJV)

Definitions: **(1)**Can two **walk** -3212 yalak-to go, to walk, to come, to depart, to proceed, to move, to go away **2** to die, to live, manner of life. **(2)together**-3162 yachad (yakh'-ad);from 3161; properly, a unit, i.e. (adverb) unitedly: -alike, at all (once), both, likewise, only, (al-) together; 1) union, unitedness as an adverb: 2) together, all together, alike. **(3)**except they **be agreed**-3259 ya` ad (yaw-ad'); a primitive root; to fix upon (by agreement or appointment); by implication, to meet to summon (to trial), to direct (in a certain quarter or position), to engage (for marriage): -agree, assemble (selves), betroth.

Gen 5:22 And Enoch walked with God after he begat Methuselah three hundred years, and begat sons and daughters: (KJV)

Gen 6:9 These are the generations of Noah: Noah was a just man and perfect in his generations, and Noah walked with God. (KJV)

Gen 17:1 And when Abram was ninety years old and nine, the LORD appeared to Abram, and said unto him, I am the Almighty God; walk before me, and be thou perfect. (KJV)

Job 1:1 There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name was Job; and that man was perfect and upright, and one that feared God, and eschewed evil. (KJV)

But in Job's sufferings he became weak and lost his way, as some do today. Then there are the many that do not understand that those of the Lord Jesus must suffer, or they rebelliously choose not to! **In (Chapters 1-2) Job is tested.** In **(Chapters 3-31)** the three "friends" of Job, FALSELY comforts him. In **Chapters 32-38:2 God sends Elihu** to remind him what afflictions were for and his lack of knowledge and reverence. In **(Chapters 38:3-42:6) God, he himself speaks to Job,** reminding him of all His power, and the weakness of man. You will also find the humility and conversion, "repentance" of Job. In **Chapter 42:7-17** the rebuke of Job's friends, and their restoration.

Amos 5:14 Seek good, and not evil, that ye may live: and so the LORD, the God of hosts, shall be with you, as ye have spoken. (KJV)

Rom 12:16 Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits.(KJV)

1 Cor 1:9 God is faithful, by whom ye were called unto the fellowship of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord. **10** Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment.(KJV)

1 Cor 1:13 Is Christ divided? was Paul crucified for you? or were ye baptized in the name of Paul?

2 Cor 6:13 Now for a recompence in the same, (I speak as unto my children,) be ye also

enlarged. **14** Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for **what fellowship** hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and **what communion** hath light with darkness? **15** And **what concord** hath Christ with Belial? or **what part** hath he that believeth with an infidel? **16** And **what agreement** hath the temple of God with idols? for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. **17** Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, **18** And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty.(KJV)

2 Cor 12:17 Did I make a gain of you by any of them whom I sent unto you? **18** I desired Titus, and with him I sent a brother. Did Titus make a gain of you? walked we not in the same spirit? walked we not in the same steps?(KJV)

2 Cor 12:18 ... walked we not in the same spirit? (KJV)

Phil 2:19 But I trust in the Lord Jesus to send Timotheus shortly unto you, that I also may be of good comfort, when I know your state. **20 For I have no man likeminded, who will naturally care for your state.** **21 For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's.**(KJV)

2 Cor 12:18 ... in the same steps? (KJV)

Acts 20:32 And now, brethren, I commend you to God, and to the **word of his grace**, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance among all them **which are sanctified.** **33** I have coveted no man's silver, or gold, or apparel. **34** Yea, ye yourselves know, that these hands have ministered unto my necessities, and to them that were with me.(KJV)

1 Pet 1:13 Wherefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and hope to the end for the grace that is to be brought unto you at the revelation of Jesus Christ; **14** As obedient children, not fashioning yourselves according to the former lusts in your ignorance: **15** But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation; **16** Because it is written, Be ye holy; for I am holy. **17** And if ye call on the Father, who without respect of persons judgeth according to every man's work, pass the time of your sojourning here in fear: **18** Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; **19** But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot: **20** Who verily was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you, **21** Who by him do believe in God, that raised him up from the dead, and gave him glory; that your faith and hope might be in God. **22** Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently: **23** Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever. **24** For all flesh is as grass, and all the glory of man as the flower of grass. The grass withereth, and the flower thereof falleth away: **25** But the word of the Lord endureth for ever. And this is the word which by the gospel is preached unto you. **CHAPTER 2:1** Wherefore laying aside all malice, and all guile, and hypocrisies, and envies, and all evil speakings, **2** As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby: **3** If so be ye have tasted that the Lord is gracious. **4** To whom coming, as unto a living stone, **(1)disallowed (2)indeed of men**, but **(3)chosen** of God, and **(4)precious**, **5** Ye also, as (5)lively (6)stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, **(7)to offer up spiritual sacrifices**, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ.(KJV)

Definitions: (1)**disallowed**-593 apodokimazo (ap-od-ok-ee-mad'-zo); from 575 and 1381; to disapprove, i.e. (by implication) to repudiate: KJV-- disallow, reject. 575 apo-1) used of separation c) used of any kind of separation of one thing from another by which the union or fellowship of the two is destroyed d) used of a state of separation, that is, of distance: physical: used of distance of place temporal. (2)**indeed** of men-3303 men-truly, certainly, surely, indeed. (3)**chosen** of God-1588 eklektos (ek-lek-tos'); from 1586; select; by implication, favorite: KJV-- chosen, elect. 1586 eklegomai (ek-leg'-om-ahee); middle voice from 1537 and 3004 (in its primary sense); to select: KJV-- make choice, choose (out), chosen. (4)**precious**-1784 entimos (en'-tee-mos); from 1722 and 5092; valued (figuratively), held in honor, prized, precious: KJV-- dear, more honourable, precious, in reputation. (5)**lively**-2198 zao (dzah'-o); a primary verb; to live (literally or figuratively): KJV-- life (-time), (a-) live (-ly), quick. (6)**stones**-3037 lithos-a stone c) metaphorically, used of Christ. (7)**to offer up spiritual sacrifices-Rom 12:1** I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God. (KJV)

1 Pet 2:20 For what glory is it, if, when ye be buffeted for your faults, ye shall take it patiently? but if, when ye do well, and suffer for it, ye take it patiently, this is acceptable with God. **21** For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps: **22** Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth:(KJV)

1 Pet 4:1 Forasmuch then as Christ hath suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves likewise with the same mind: for he that hath suffered in the flesh hath ceased from sin; **2** That he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God.(KJV)

2 Pet 2:1 But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction. **2** And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of truth shall be evil spoken of. **3** And through covetousness shall they with feigned words make merchandise of you: whose judgment now of a long time lingereth not, and their damnation slumbereth not.(KJV)

1 Jn 1:5 This then is the message which we have heard of him, and declare unto you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. **6** If we say that we have fellowship with him, and (1)**walk** in (1)**darkness**, we lie, and do not the truth: **7** But if we walk in the (2)**light**, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin.(KJV)

Definitions: (1)**walk**-4043 peripateo (per-ee-pat-eh'-o); from 4012 and 3961; to tread all around, i.e. walk at large (especially as proof of ability); figuratively, to live, deport oneself, follow (as a companion or votary), b) 1) to regulate one's life 2) to conduct oneself 3) to pass one's life: KJV-- go, be occupied with, walk (about). (2)**darkness**-4653 skotia (skot-ee'-ah); from 4655; dimness, obscurity (literally or figuratively): KJV-- dark (-ness), shadiness, 4639 skia (skee'-ah); apparently a primary word; "shade" or a shadow (literally or figuratively [darkness of error or an adumbration]): KJV-- shadow. (3)**light**-5457 phos-1) light a) the light 1) emitted by a lamp b) anything that emits light 2) metaphorically: a) **God is light**; b) **used of truth and its knowledge, together with the spiritual purity associated with it**; the power of understanding especially moral and **spiritual truth**
